

ULM Announces Holiday Break

Schedule: Campus Closes December 18, Reopens January 5; Spring Classes Begin January 12

The University of Louisiana Monroe (ULM) has officially announced its holiday break schedule, providing clarity for students, faculty, staff, and campus visitors planning ahead for the end of the year.
