Whether it's a simple gesture, a conversation about boundaries, or a scene where Mahiro tests something he learned, the manga focuses more on emotional atmosphere than shock value. Even the kink-adjacent scenes are presented with restraint, prioritizing character development over explicitness.

Because of this measured approach, the manga feels both gentle and vulnerable despite its adult themes.
