Common visual themes include:

- Midnight Mass celebrations drawing thousands
- Nativity scenes adapted to local cultures
- Choirs singing traditional carols in native languages

- Children participating in pageants and reenactments
- Religious processions through city streets and villages

Each image adds depth to the understanding of how Christianity is lived and practiced worldwide.
